



Fly Pattern Sheet:

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Emulator:

Materials Needed:

Hook: Daiichi 2461 size 1/0 or other large streamer hook 3xl or longer

Tail: Copper flashabou and Tan Grizzly Marabou

Body: Emu Feather wound tightly forward

Hackle: Schlappen, usually brown or olive

Pectoral Fins: A clump of mallard flank feather fibers tied on either side of fly

Head: Clump of Australian possum fur or ram's wool.

Steps for tying this fly:

1. Cover the hook with thread and bring thread to the beginning of the bend.
2. Tie in a tail of tan or olive grizzly marabou; splay one feather to each side. Add a little flash if you would like (but this fly works just fine plain).
3. Tie in the schlappen feather by the tip.
4. Tie in the emu feather, wind it forward to about 2/3 the way up the hook.
5. Wind the schlappen through the emu.
6. Tie in a collar of mallard flank feathers or use clumps of mallard as pectoral fins.
7. Tie a clump of thick Australian possum or ram's wool as a head.
8. Finish the fly.

Comments: Originally devised years ago as a smallmouth bass fly, this fly became a favorite steelhead fly and I still rely on it at times today.
