



Fly Pattern Sheet:

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Fire Spey:

Materials:

Hook: Up eye spey hook with wire weight to match conditions. (Heavy wire sinks better than light wire). Large sizes from 2-3/0 are welcome.

Rear Body: Flashabou Mirage Fringe used as a tail and the remainder is wound halfway up the body.

Hackle : Yellow and Orange Jailhouse marabou wound through the body

Body: Olive Ice dub or blood black Hare's ice dub, wound to just behind the eye.

Collar: Olive Marabou wound once or twice

Wing Flash: Fire Tiger Holographic Flashabou and red flashabou. If fire tiger is not available, use a combination of copper, yellow, and green flashabou.

Topping: Two strands of long olive ostrich herl.

Tying Instructions:

- 1. Tie in some flashabou mirage fringe or large pearl tinsel and wind 2/3 up the body of the fly. If flashabou is used, pull the remaining flash back as an underwing.
- 2. Strip half of the marabou feather and tie it in by the tip. If yellow and orange is not available, you can use yellow, orange, black, or olive marabou. They all work.
- 3. Dub a body of ice dub.
- 4. Wind the marabou in wide wraps through the body. Add a collar of olive marabou.
- 5. Top the fly with fire tiger holographic flashabou and red flashobou.
- 6. Add a topping of two strands of olive ostrich herl (optional).

Comments: This fly is a colorful mix of modern materials. The fire tiger flashabou is becoming available but you can create similar colors by blending strands of flashabou yourself. This fly is good for early steelhead but also takes lake run brown trout.
