Printable Tying Instructions for the Thunder Chicken:

Materials:

Hook: Daiichi 2461 or equivalent 3xl streamer hook size 4-2/0
Tail: Two cree or blue barred hackle feathers topped with pearl lateral scale.
Hackle: A large Mallard flank feather, palmered through the body.
Body: Black peacock or peacock ice dub
Flash: Pink, fuchsia, and silver holographic flashabou surrounded by blue flashabou.
Head: Fuchsia large cactus chenille or hot pink ice dub followed by a veil of chartreuse ice dub
Eyes: Two dumbbell eyes.

Tying Instructions:

Step 1: Cover the hook with thread using tight wraps and bring the thread to the back of the hook.

Step 2: Tie in a tail of two splayed cree saddle feathers, add a few strands of later scale flash over the top or pearl saltwater flashabou.

Step 3: Tie in the mallard feather by its tip.

Step 4: Dub a body of peacock or black peacock ice dub that goes 2/3 up the hook.

Step 5: Palmer the mallard flank until you reach the end of the body and tie off.

Step 6: Add flash to the top of the fly in layers. First add some silver, pink and fuschia holographic flashabou both above and below the body. Add a final layer of blue.

Step 7: Tie in lead dumbbell eyes just behind the eye of the hook.

Step 8: Tie a piece of cactus chenille and wind it forward for a couple of turns, leaving a little bit of room behind the eyes.

Step 9: Force a clump of chartreuse ice dubbing just behind the eye of the hook and bind it with your thread so that it forms a circular veil over the dumbbell eyes and the cactus chenille.

Step 10: Finish the fly.
